Fees: Program fee is \$300 for applications received by September 30, \$450 for applications received October 1 – 15. The program fee includes: Two nights lodging at host hotel, meals, education sessions and two USDF University credits upon completion of the program.

APPLICANT CRITERIA

Age: Must be between 20 & 28 years of age
Membership: Must be a current USDF PM or GM member
Qualifications: Riding at Third Level or above
Deadline: For applications to be considered, the completed application and any supporting documents must be received in the USDF office on or before September 30, 2019 for the advance fee (\$300), or October 15 for the increased fee (\$450).

The USDF Youth Programs Committee shall consider all applications received by October 15, 2019; preference will be given to those applying by the September 30 deadline. Selection will be based upon demonstrated commitment to riding, training and/or teaching, and evidence of proficiency at Third Level or above. Recommendations may be submitted to support the completed application.
